In the garage:

- antifreeze
- motor oil & oil filters
- engine cleaners
- waxes & polishes
- gasoline
- brake fluid



In the workshop:

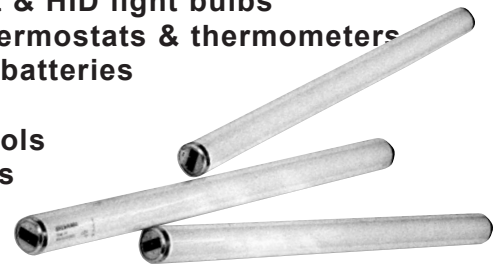
- paint
- paint thinner
- solvents
- photo chemicals
- wood preservatives
- wood finishes
- loose asbestos

Dried up paint cans can go in the trash. Leave lid off.



In the house:

- bleach-based cleaners
- polishes
- oven cleaners
- fluorescent & HID light bulbs
- mercury thermostats & thermometers
- household batteries
- nail polish
- toxic aerosols
- medications



In the yard:

- pesticides • weed killers
- fungicides • pool chemicals

The Ukiah HazMobile gives away free paint from the usable leftovers brought to us by the public. Colors vary. It comes in 5 gallon buckets and is for outdoor use. The free paint is available every Tuesday from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. and the 2nd Saturday of each month at 298A Plant Road, Ukiah.

Medicines go to HazMobile Not down the drain

Leftover medicines should be brought to the HazMobile for disposal, not flushed down the drain. Scientists are increasingly warning not to flush drugs. Antibiotics, hormones, and other medicines are being found in waterways, raising worrisome questions about potential health and environmental effects.

Drugs like antibiotics, anti-depressants, birth control pills, seizure medication, cancer treatments, pain killers, and tranquilizers have been detected in various water sources.
